What is the Multiannual Financial Framework?

The Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF), or the EU's long-term budget, lays down how much the **European Union** can invest over **7** years – on projects and programmes that strengthen Europe's future. Thus, above all, it is an expression of the political priorities set. It brings together:



The EU's long-term budget helps millions of students, thousands of researchers, cities, businesses, regions and NGOs. **The idea behind it is that pulling resources together makes Europe stronger and is key to boosting prosperity and peace**

What is the MFF?

- Unlike national budgets, the EU budget is more of an investment budget: It does not fund social protection, primary education or national defence, but rather the key areas that provide European added value by boosting growth and competitiveness.

- It is predictable:

The MFF ensures a stable and predictable inflow of resources for the Union's long-term priorities. This predictability is crucial, for example, for researcher that work on scientific researches that take several years to complete.

- It ensures Europe's role as a global actor

The challenges we face are global. The EU budget provides the means for a global response to tackle transnational issues that affect all human beings.

How is the EU long-term budget funded?

The financing of the EU's long-term budget is complex as there are several sources of income. They include own traditional resources, which are:

- Import duties on products from outside the EU
- Contributions from member states (based on VAT receipts and on GNI)
- Fines imposed on companies breaking EU competition rules

Peculiarities of the MFF 2021-2027

More flexibility



To cope with unforeseen crises and emergencies (such as COVID-19), this new long-term budget has been made more flexible than its predecessors. It therefore includes - for extraordinary situations - a number of instruments to ensure that money can be used where it is most needed.

Rule of law



For the first time, the EU has approved a specific conditionality mechanism to protect its budget from violations of the rule of law.

This means that if a state acts in a way that is not in line with European values and fundamental rights, it risks having its EU funds blocked.

Peculiarities of the MFF 2021-2027

It is a budget both firmly oriented towards the green and digital transition and strongly focused on the reconstruction of post-COVID-19 Europe. Indeed:

- More than **50%** of EU funds will support recovery and digitisation in Europe
- **30 %** of the EU budget will be allocated to the fight against climate change, which is the highest share ever allocated in European history.

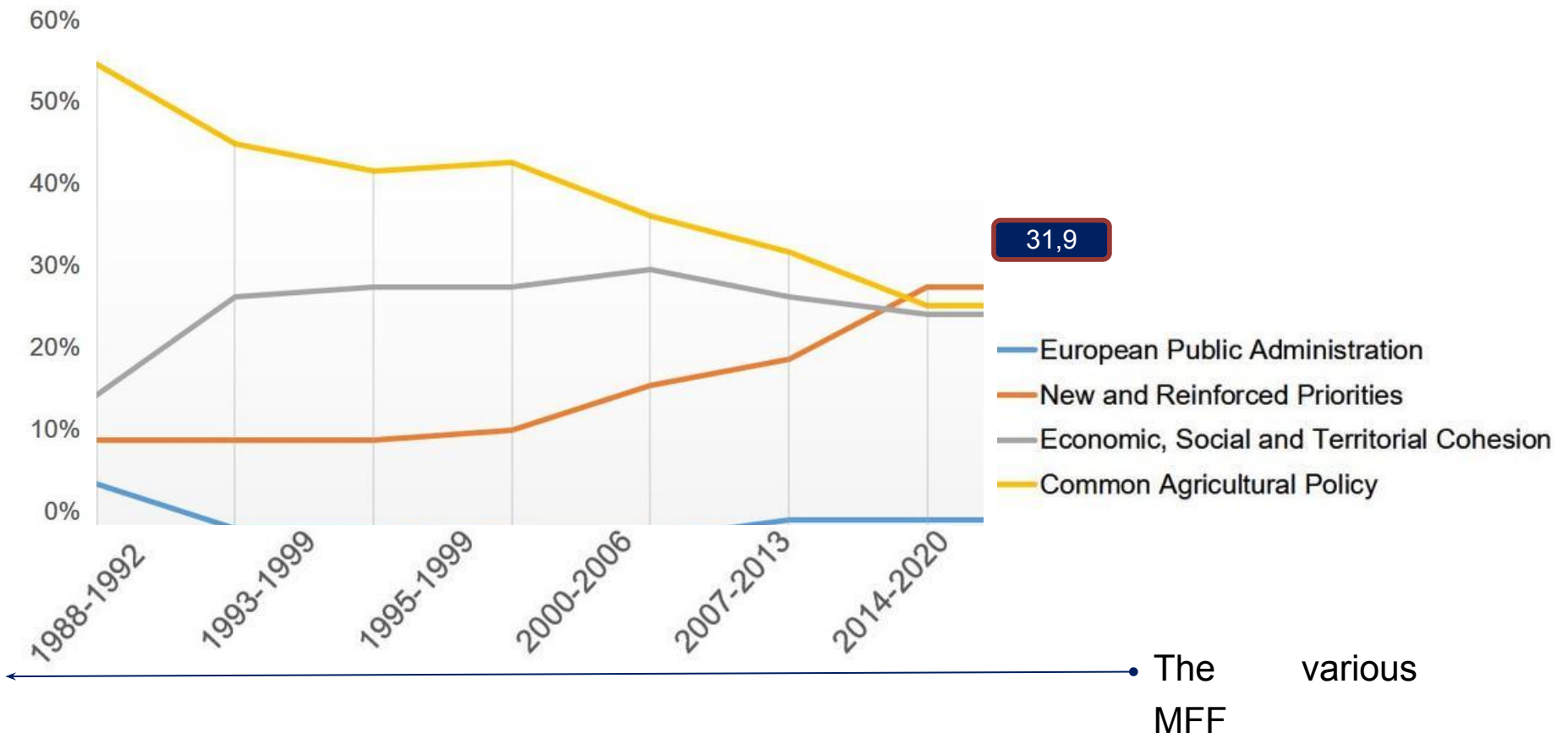
- It is a record budget

With both its EUR 1,074 billion and the respective EUR 750 billion from the new recovery instrument (Next Generation Eu), the Union's multiannual budget amounts to EUR 1. 824.3 billion.

Evolution of the main areas of intervention in the EU budgets

For the first time ever, the new and strengthened priorities (**Green & Digital**) have the highest share within the long-term budget, i.e. **31.9%**.

In comparison, the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP) funds and the funds for economic, social and territorial cohesion account for 30.9% and 30.4% of the budget respectively.

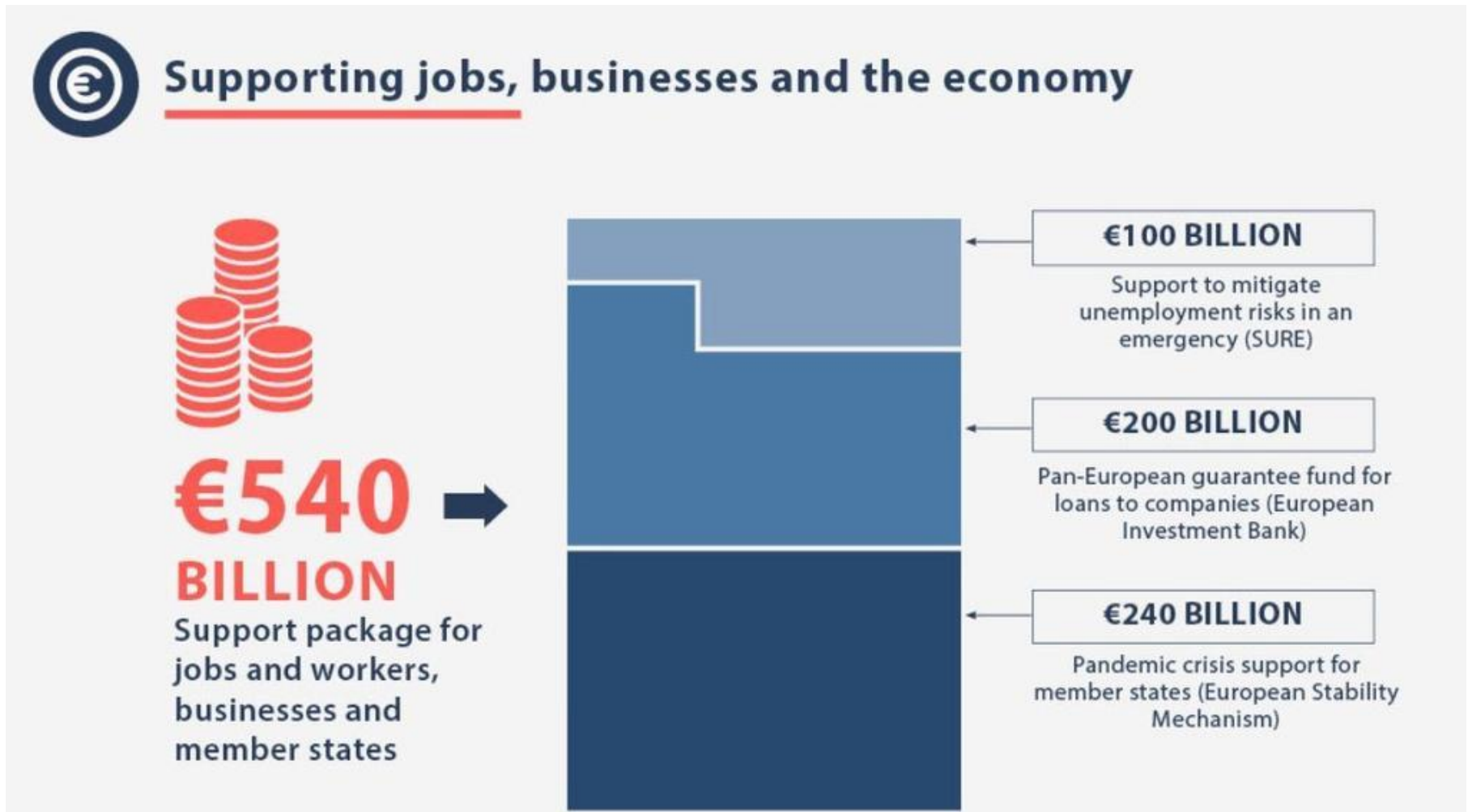

On 9 April 2020, the Eurogroup agreed on 3 safety nets for workers, businesses and Member States worth EUR 540 billion.

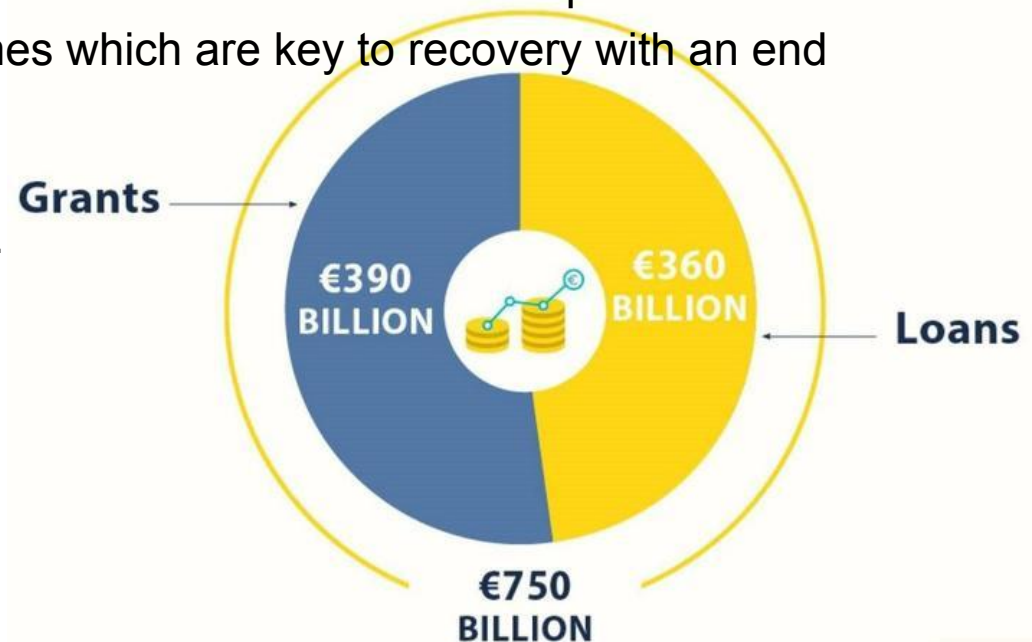

The [European Commission](#), using its strong credit rating will borrow EUR 750 billion. This additional funding will be channelled into the different MFF programmes and will be repaid through future EU budgets: **not before 2028 and not after 2058.**

- NGEU is a one-off emergency instrument, put in place for a temporary period and used exclusively for crisis response;
- The funds are channelled to MSs to support investment and reform priorities and are used to reinforce financial programmes which are key to recovery with an end date by 31 December 2024;
- It raises funds from the financial markets.



Recovery and resilience facility (RRF)

The RRF entered into force on 19 February 2021.

It finances reforms and investments in Member States from the start of the pandemic in February 2020 until 31 December 2026.

To benefit from the support of the Facility, Member States submit their recovery and resilience plans to the European Commission. Each plan sets out the reforms and investments to be implemented by end-2026 and Member States can receive financing up to a previously agreed allocation.



Key objectives to be pursued via the RRF:

- Improving its economic growth potential
- Creating jobs
- Aiming for the Green&Digital transition

The Commission - as stated in the official document - encourages States to follow these parameters:

- 1** Power up
Anticipating the deployment of clean technologies adapted to the needs of the future and accelerating the development and use of renewables
- 2** Renovate
Improving the energy efficiency of public and private buildings
- 3** Recharge and refuel
Promoting clean technologies adapted to the needs of the future to accelerate the use of sustainable, accessible and intelligent transport systems, charging and refuelling stations and the expansion of public transport

Guidelines RRF

- 4 **Connect**
The fast rollout of rapid broadband services to all regions and households, including fiber and 5G networks.
- 5 **Modernise**
The digitalisation of public administration and services, including judicial and healthcare systems
- 6 **Scale-up**
The increase in European industrial data cloud capacities and the development of the most powerful, cutting edge, and sustainable processors
- 7 **Reskill and upskill**
The adaptation of education systems to support digital skills and educational and vocational training for all ages.

Recovery and Resilience Facility

To benefit from the RRF, **Member States** should submit their draft recovery and resilience plans outlining national investment and reform agendas in line with the EU

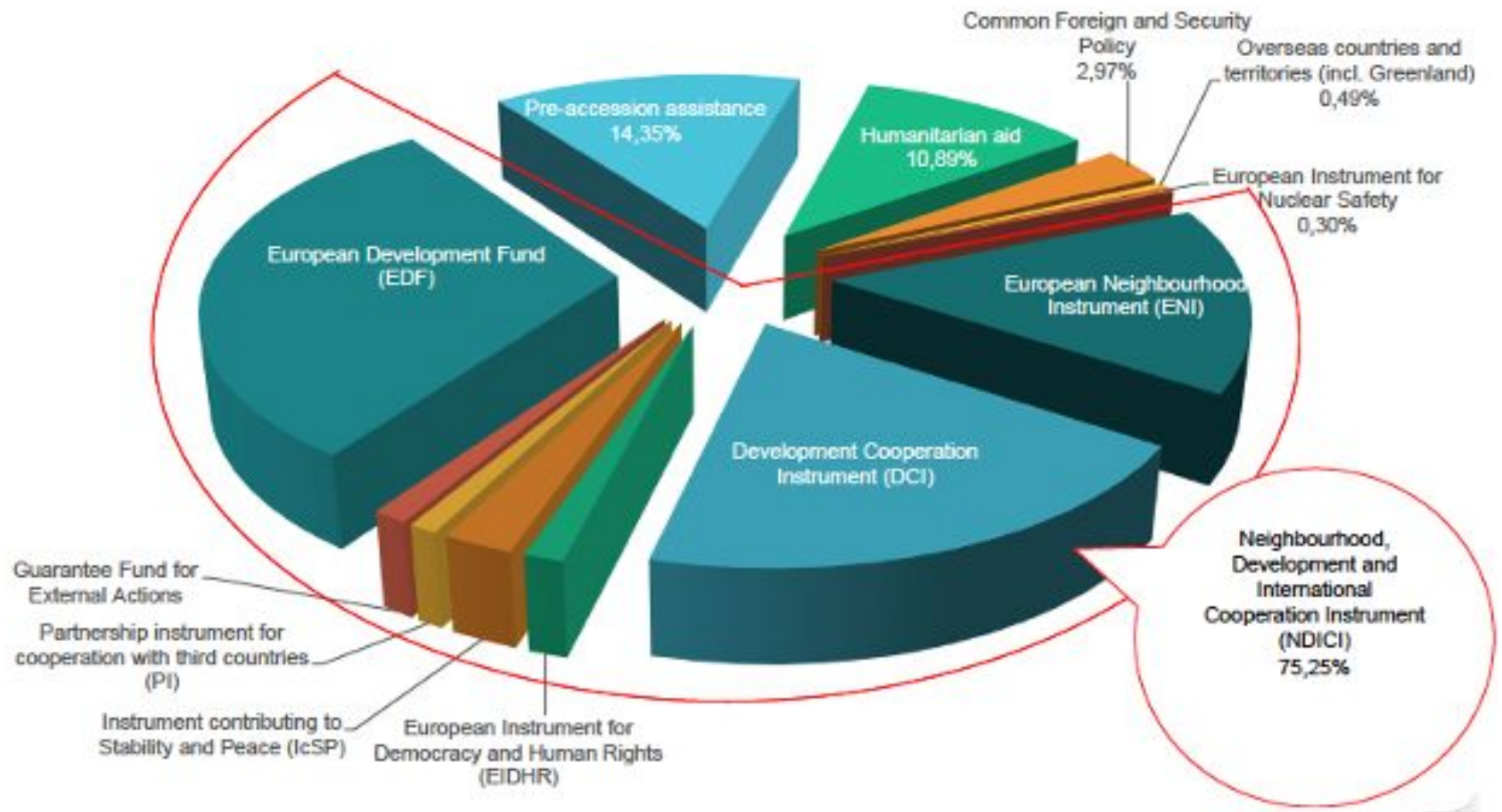

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
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Find a suitable call for proposal

- You may start your search from the home page by entering different keywords that characterize best your field of interest, and then refine the results with the help of further filters.
 - You may start your search by selecting one of the EU funding programmes listed on the home page, and then navigate via the quick links to the calls for proposals of a specific programme.
 - Calls are divided into topics, implemented by different type of actions. Select a topic to read more about the identified opportunity: the topic-related documents, guidance and other instructions are available on a topic page.

To return to your registration, please log in and get into My Organisation(s) in the My Area section. Incomplete, draft registrations are automatically deleted after one year. Additionally, for actions where the SME status is an eligibility criterion (like, e.g. the SME Instrument) you must also carry out the SME self-assessment. Should your project or tender be successfully evaluated, the registered data will be verified by the Validation Service team before the signature of the Grant Agreement or of the Framework Contract.

PADOR

The Potential Applicant Data On-Line Registration ([e-calls PADOR](#)) is a database of legal entities. It is the on-line system in which organisations, who are potential applicants to calls for proposals, register and regularly update information about their profile (legal, financial, etc.). Every organisation in e-Calls PADOR has a unique identification number (EuropeAid ID - EID). The organisation has to mention this EID in the application submitted to a call for proposals via [e-Calls PROSPECT](#) (the IT system for online submission).

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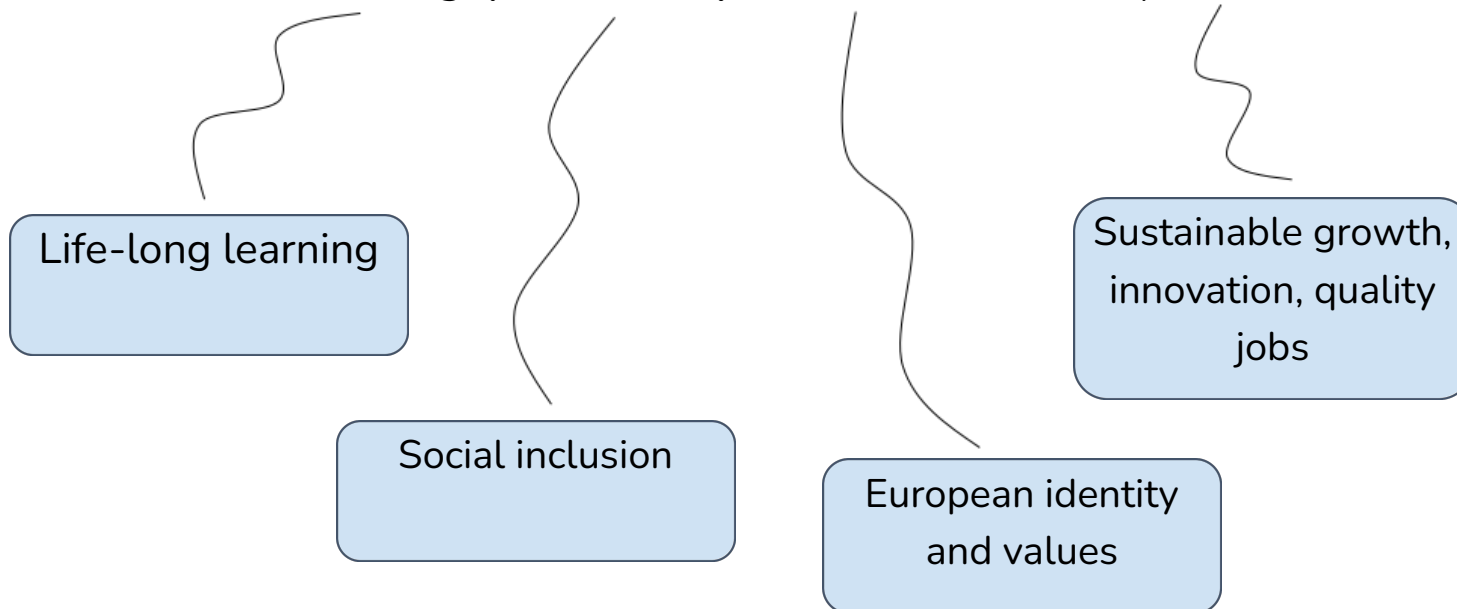

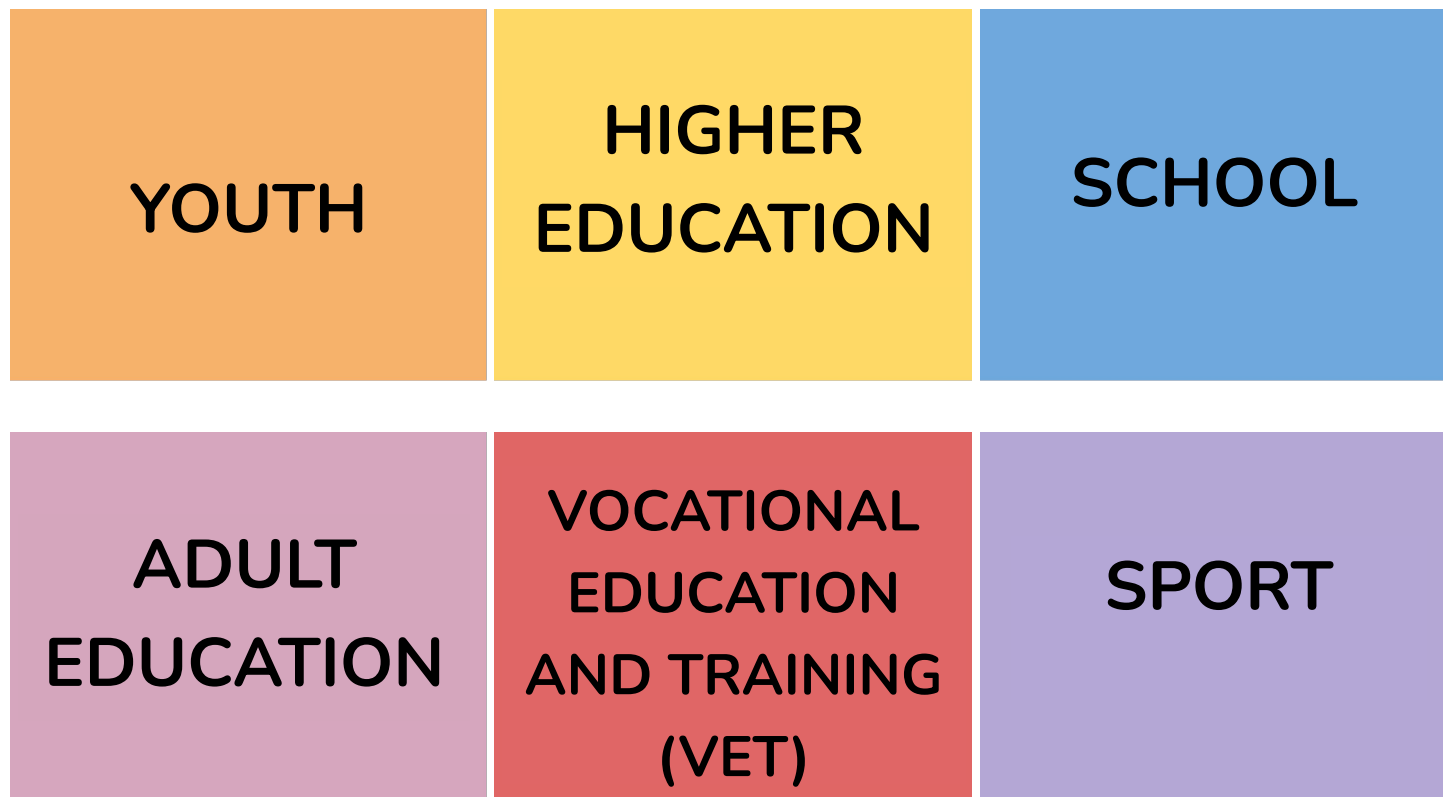

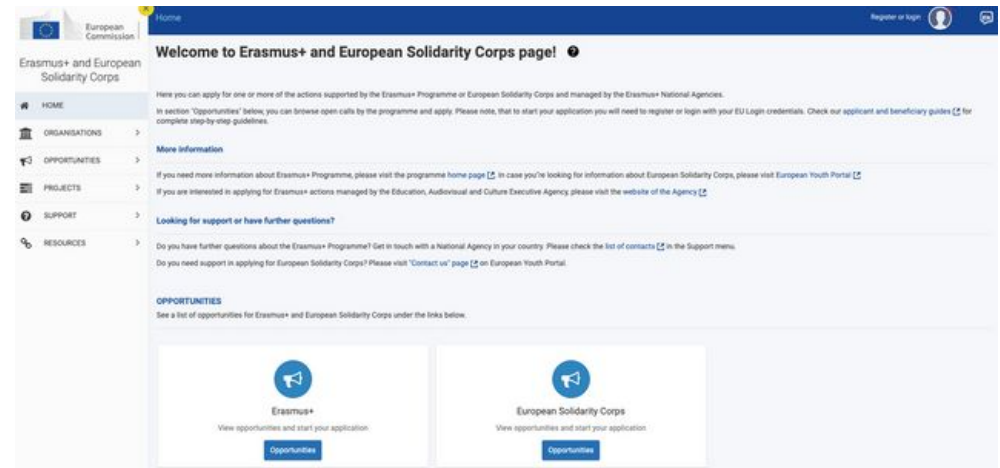

To be able to apply to decentralized Erasmus+ call for proposal you will need to create the OID code. Once you have obtained the PIC, you will need to log in through a second portal, which you can find [here](#). At the top right is the "register or log in" button. Theoretically, the system is unified so it should recognize you as soon as you enter the email and password used when the PIC was created.

From there on, you need to enter additional organization data to finally get the OID. These two codes will be required for you to submit project proposals and, in general, serve as identification codes for your organization.



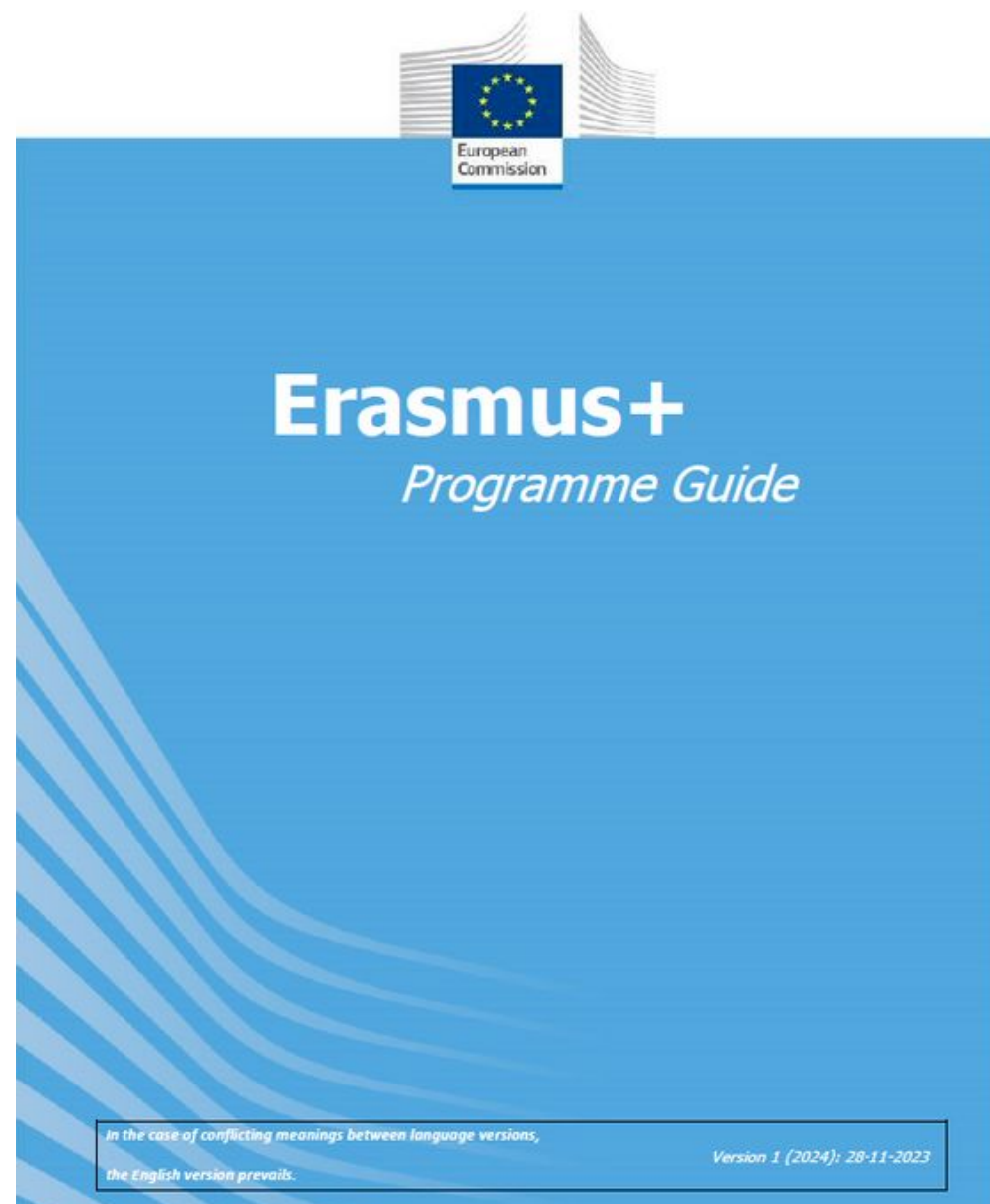

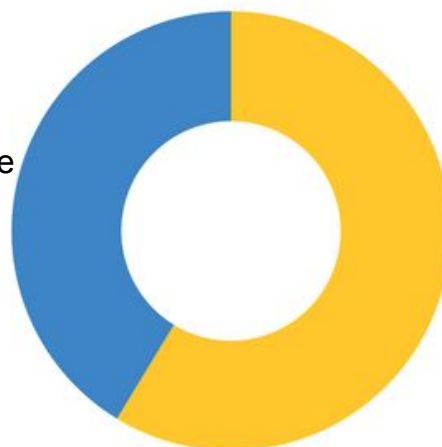
Overall budget 2021-2027

1. Union Values

Objective: to **protect, promote and raise awareness** of EU fundamental rights and values by supporting local, regional and/or national **civil society organisations (CSOs)** and increasing their capacity thereby also strengthening the effective application of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union and the respect of the rule of law and of democracy in the EU.

Projects under this strand shall:

- Ensure **capacity building** for active at local, regional and/or national level in the fields covered by the CERV programme
- Propose **financial support** to these CSOs

2. Equality Rights and Gender Equality

Objectives:

- To promote **non-discrimination**, preventing and combating inequalities and discrimination based on sex, racial or ethnic origin, religion or belief, disability, age or sexual orientation and respect for the principle of non-discrimination on the basis of Article 21 of the EU Charter, combating all forms of discrimination, **racism**, **xenophobia**, **transphobia**, **anti-Semitism**, **anti-Gypsyism**, **anti-Muslim** hatred and other forms of intolerance.
- To promote **Gender equality** and gender mainstreaming, promoting women's full enjoyment of their rights, gender equality, including work-life balance

Preventing and **combating violence in all its forms**, including gender-based violence. Projects in this area aim to:

- prevent and combat at all levels all forms of **gender-based violence** against women and girls and domestic violence, including by promoting the standards set out in the Istanbul Convention;
- prevent and combat all forms of **violence against children, young people**, as well as violence against **other groups at risk**, such as LGBTQI persons and persons with disabilities;
- to **support and protect all direct and indirect victims** of such violence, such as domestic violence within the family or violence in intimate relationships, including children orphaned by domestic crimes, and to support and ensure the same level of protection throughout the Union for victims of gender-based violence.

ERDF - AN OVERVIEW

The European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) is similar in scope to the EFS+. However, it is mainly aimed at strengthening the **economic, social and territorial cohesion** among EU Member States. Therefore, its main purpose is to **reduce imbalances between EU regions**, especially by investing in a “smarter, greener, more connected and more social Europe” ([European Commission](#)).

Overall, ERDF has a budget of around **200 billion EUR** for the period 2021-2027.



FUNDING MECHANISMS

The ERDF programme also follows a **shared management approach**.

This collaborative effort involves both the European Commission and national/regional authorities in Member States.

The administrations of **Member States are responsible for project funding decisions** and for the daily management of the funds. →

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Organisations that can benefit from regional funding include **public bodies**, some private sector organisations (especially **small businesses**), **universities, associations, NGOs** and voluntary organisations.

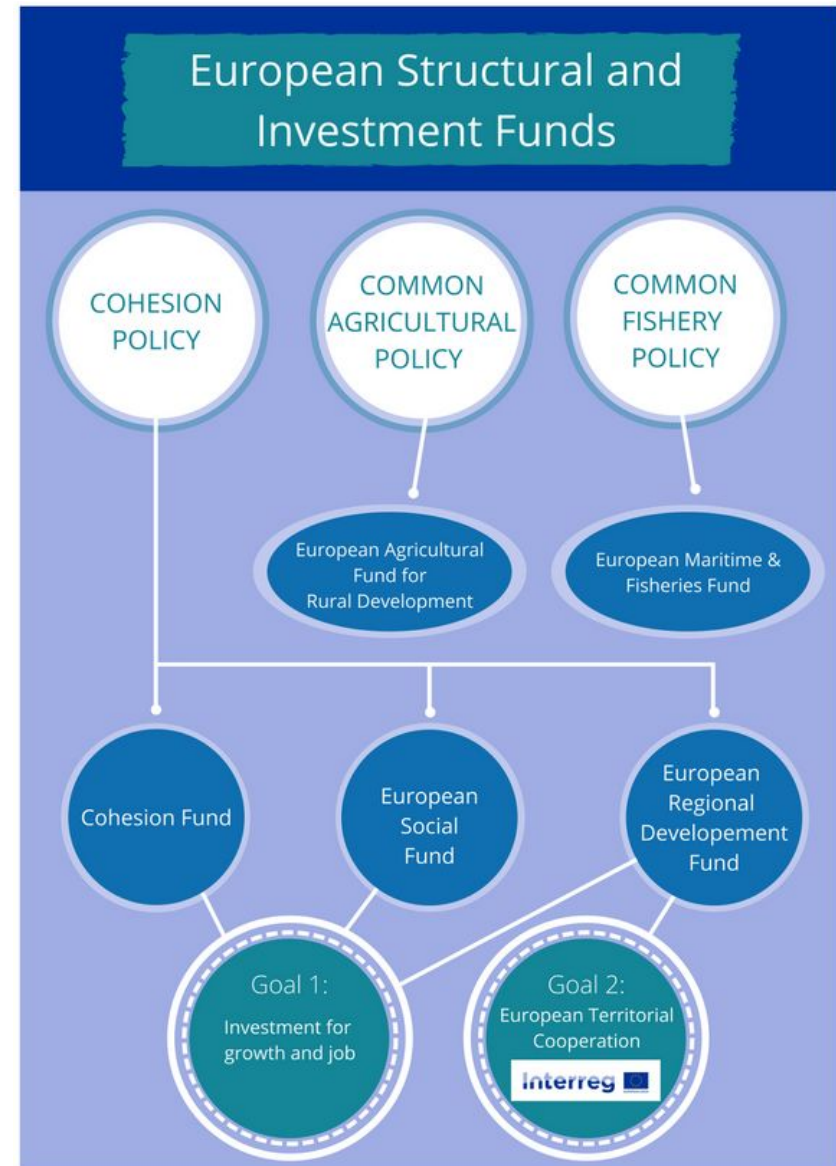
